November is Veterans and Military Families Month

Veterans & Military Families Month was established in 1996 by the Armed Services YMCA, with the U.S. Government recognizing the occasion every year since. Each November, the President signs a proclamation declaring November National Veterans & Military Families Month, and with hundreds of thousands of service members deployed overseas, recognizing the daily sacrifices made by active duty, Guard, and Reserve military families has never been more important. There are many local and national services provided to show appreciation during National Veterans & Military Families Month and beyond. Here are just a few:

- Every year you should be able to download a 'Military Family Month' packet from the <u>Armed Services YMCA</u> at <u>www.asymca.org</u>. The packet typically contains: a Military Family Month Poster; a Message from the President; a letter from the National Executive Director of the ASYMCA; Military Family Month Program Suggestions; and Guidelines for the annual art and essay contests.
- <u>Sesame Street for Military Families Free App</u> Addresses topics such as deployments, homecoming, self-expression and injuries.
- Military children can find comfort in a free custom made photo transfer quilt or pillow through this program for children of deployed service members Operation Kid Comfort.
- •Many Military Families are eligible for a free YMCA or Private Fitness membership through the YMCA- DoD Initiative with the Armed Services YMCA.
- Home Depot offers a 10% in-store discount for those with valid military ID, but the company is also recognized as an important employer of military spouses. A Home Depot employee-run resource called Military Appreciation Group, "is dedicated strictly to supporting active military associates, deployed reservists and their families" according to the Home Depot official site.
- •College campuses with ROTC units may host parades featuring trainee Reserve officers marching, displaying the colors, holding drills, etc. These events may be organized on campus, or ROTC units may partner with local organizers for events in the community.

South Dakota Legionnaire Competing for Ms. Veteran America

A South Dakota American Legion Family member will head to Orlando, Fla., on Oct. 30 as one of the 25 finalists for Ms. Veteran America. In addition to meeting a lot of who she now considers friends through the competition, she's also learned quite a bit about an issue sometimes overlooked: the homeless women veteran population.

Ms. Veteran America serves as an ambassador for Final Salute Inc., a nonprofit that provides homeless women veterans and their children safe housing, along with food, clothing and supportive services. It was learning about Final Salute and doing research on her own that made Legionnaire Kaylan "Katie" Harrington aware of how many women veterans find themselves without housing.

Harrington is a 21-year member of the South Dakota Army National Guard, where she serves as a training officer at the Guard's Warrant Officer Candidate School. A chief warrant officer 4 who has been deployed four times to Iraq and twice to Afghanistan, she said taking part in Ms. Veteran American was a reach for her.

Harrington applied to be a part of the competition and then competed in the semifinals in June, when contestants had to go through interviews, and talent and advocacy competitions, as well as show how much each had raised toward and promoted Final Salute.

Tell Congress to Pass National Buddy Check Week

Following closely on the heels of the successful PACT Act passage, another piece of legislation The American Legion strongly endorses is the <u>STRONG Veterans Act</u>, which would make The American Legionborn Buddy Check initiative a national VA requirement.

The STRONG Veterans Act (Support The Resiliency of Our Nation's Great Veterans Act) calls on the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to designate a "National Buddy Check Week." It is modeled after The American Legion's successful Buddy Check program, which nearly 4,000 local posts a year have used to help veterans in need since 2019. It also includes dozens of provisions that come from standalone pieces of legislation The American Legion supports.

The legislation promises to bring additional improvements to the mental health care of our nation's veterans. Those include:

- Funding research on veterans' mental health and treatment.
- Making the Peer Specialist Support program permanent.
- Increasing full-time staffing at VA Vet Centers and expanding eligibility for treatment.
- Expanding existing scholarship and loan programs for students and mental health providers.

In June, the U.S. House of Representatives approved the measure in a bipartisan voice vote. It now awaits action in the Senate. The legislation has sat in the Senate for several months already. We cannot afford to let this opportunity to improve mental health care for veterans lapse. Source: American Legion National Commander

A few facts you may not know about the Bill of Rights, which has existed since 1769 (ratified 1791):

- It was inspired by the Magna Carta, the English Bill of Rights of 1689 & the Virginia Declaration of Rights of 1776.
- It didn't actually apply to all individuals until 130 after it was made.
- A college student got one of the amendments that was originally nixed ratified in 1992 (XXVII).
- There were 14 handwritten copies, but only 12 remain today.
- A Union soldier stole North Carolina's copy of the Bill of Rights and then sold it.
- 3 states did not ratify it until 1939.
- The 3rd Amendment is the least litigated.
- President FDR instituted the celebration of Bill of Rights Day on its anniversary in 1941.
